

FOR CONSIDERATION

- PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES ARE THREE TIMES MORE LIKELY TO BE VICTIMS OF NON-FATAL CRIMES THAN PEOPLE WITHOUT DISABILITIES (HARRELL, 2014).
- A REPORTED 94% OF PEOPLE WITH ASD HAVE BEEN VICTIMS OF BULLYING (LITTLE, 2002).
- COMPARED TO STUDENTS WITH OTHER DISABILITIES, THE RISK OF REPEATED VICTIMIZATION IS HIGHEST FOR STUDENT WITH ASD (13.8 TIMES MORE LIKELY) (BLAKE, ET AL., 2012).
- **UP TO 56 % OF PEOPLE IN PRISON HAVE A MENTAL HEALTH ISSUE!**

INCLUSIVE TEEN AND YOUNG ADULT SOCIAL GROUPS

- TEACH SKILLS TO PREVENT CONTACT WITH THE SYSTEM
- FAMILIARIZE THEM WITH LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT
- WHAT TO DO IF POLICE ARE CALLED





TRAIN LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

- DISPLAY CALMING BODY LANGUAGE- SPACE
- USE SIMPLE LANGUAGE
- SPEAK SLOWLY
- USE CONCRETE IDEAS- AVOID FIGURES OF SPEECH
- ALLOW EXTRA TIME FOR RESPONSE NOT A LACK OF COMPLIANCE! COUNT TO 10
- GIVE PRAISE AND ENCOURAGEMENT
- A WORD ABOUT RESTRAINT
- GIVEN TIME AND SPACE BEHAVIOR
 MAY DE-ESCALATE
- SEEK ADVICE FROM CAREGIVERS
 ON THE SCENE

TRAIN LAWYERS AND JUDGES

- RECEPTIVE/EXPRESSIVE LANGUAGE DEFICITS
- AVOIDING EYE CONTACT
- CHECK FOR UNDERSTANDING. HAVE THE PERSON REPEAT BACK IN THEIR OWN WORDS THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THEIR RIGHTS.
- NOT NECESSARILY AN INDICATOR OF LYING OR EVASIVENESS.
- MAY MAKE IT DIFFICULT FOR THEM TO READ THE SOCIAL INTENT OF THE POLICE OFFICER.
